NOTES FOR THE JOURNEY



One of the books I have been reading this summer is called, "Bringing Back Eden - Meditations of a Fly Fisher" by Anthony Surage. In this book, Anthony has been exploring his faith journey, framed by his passion and profession of fly fishing, and guiding. He is reflecting on where he has experienced God in his life and fishing and how that has guided his life and journey in finding those Holy places, those places he calls EDEN. The following passage is one of the many that have caused me to stop and reflect on my own life.

"Then again, maybe I need to redefine true achievement and occupation. Emily Dickinson considered it her occupation to gather paradise by spreading her narrow hands. Perhaps I too can find Something of EDEN, and this is my real occupation.

As a fly fisher. I can expand my casts outward over the waters I fish, and in that process, I can open my heart to gather Something of paradise found in the natural world. Too often I live with narrow hands, failing to take in the life and beauty all around me. I also often fail to widen my narrow hands to accept people who are different or make different choices than I. In essence, in my own narrowness, I fail to love." (page 12-13)

This really reminds me of Jesus' teaching us to love our neighbors (those who have a need) and our enemies (those who maybe against us) as we love God and ourselves. I've been wondering where the areas in my life are where I can widen my hands, my heart, my head, and my life to accept those who are different and what difference that will make for them and for me. In doing so, we can participate with God in bringing the Kingdom of God into the reality of our world.

I invite you to become more active and grow in your faith and participation in the life of the church. Let's share what God is doing and see what God will be doing as we experience the peace and love of God

in our lives and church! Join us and invite your friends and neighbors to join us in worship and service together.
